By working together, we build leadership capacity, share effective practice and continually strengthen teaching and learning for the benefit of our pupils.

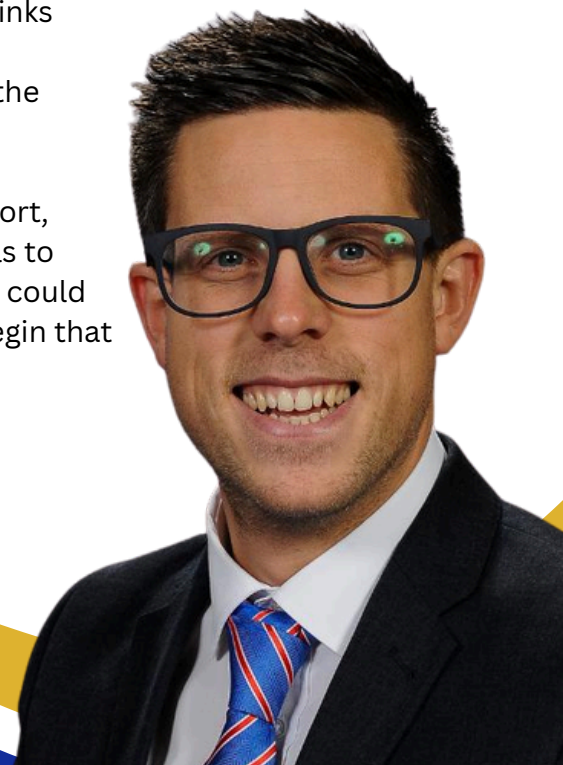

Joining MAST means becoming part of a partnership of schools working together to strengthen education for the communities we serve. Our approach is built on collaboration, shared expertise and a strong commitment to improving outcomes for every pupil.

A Partnership of Schools

MAST is built on collaboration rather than hierarchy. Schools work together as partners, sharing knowledge and supporting one another to strengthen teaching, leadership and pupil outcomes.

Schools Retain Their Identity

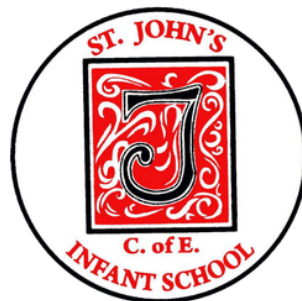
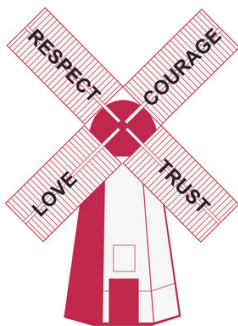




Our Schools

Improving Teaching and Learning

Strengthening practice through collaboration and shared expertise

At the heart of MAST is a shared commitment to improving outcomes for every pupil. Schools within the Trust work together to strengthen teaching, develop leadership and share effective practice, ensuring that all pupils benefit from high-quality education.

Collaborative School Improvement

Schools engage in peer review and professional dialogue, enabling leaders and teachers to reflect on practice, share what works well and support improvement across the Trust.

Subject and Curriculum Collaboration

Subject leaders work together through Trust networks to develop curriculum knowledge, share resources and strengthen teaching in their subjects. This collaboration helps ensure that pupils benefit from high-quality curriculum provision across all schools.

Leadership Development

Leaders are supported through coaching, mentoring and collaboration with colleagues across the Trust. This strengthens leadership capacity and creates opportunities for staff to develop their expertise and lead improvement.

Inclusive Education

Schools work together to strengthen inclusive practice and SEND provision, ensuring that all pupils are able to access high-quality teaching and achieve their full potential.

Through collaboration and shared expertise, MAST supports schools to continually strengthen teaching and learning for the benefit of every pupil.





Support for Schools and Staff

Helping leaders and teachers focus on high-quality education

Schools joining MAST become part of a strong professional network designed to support leaders and staff to focus on what matters most; high-quality teaching and learning. Our Trust works alongside schools to provide both strategic guidance and practical support, helping leaders build capacity while reducing unnecessary workload.

Operational Support

The Trust provides practical support in key operational areas including **finance, HR, governance and compliance**. By sharing systems, expertise and central services, we help reduce administrative pressures and enable school leaders to focus on teaching and learning. Schools benefit from guidance and support with areas such as financial planning, policy development, safeguarding compliance, estates management and governance processes. This shared operational support helps ensure that schools are well supported in meeting statutory responsibilities while maintaining a strong focus on educational priorities.

Leadership Support

Headteachers and senior leaders collaborate closely with colleagues across the Trust. Through professional dialogue, coaching and shared leadership networks, leaders are supported to reflect on practice, strengthen decision-making and develop their schools with confidence.

Professional Development

Staff benefit from Trust-wide professional development, subject networks and opportunities to collaborate with colleagues across schools. These networks enable teachers to share effective practice, develop curriculum knowledge and strengthen classroom teaching.

Shared Expertise

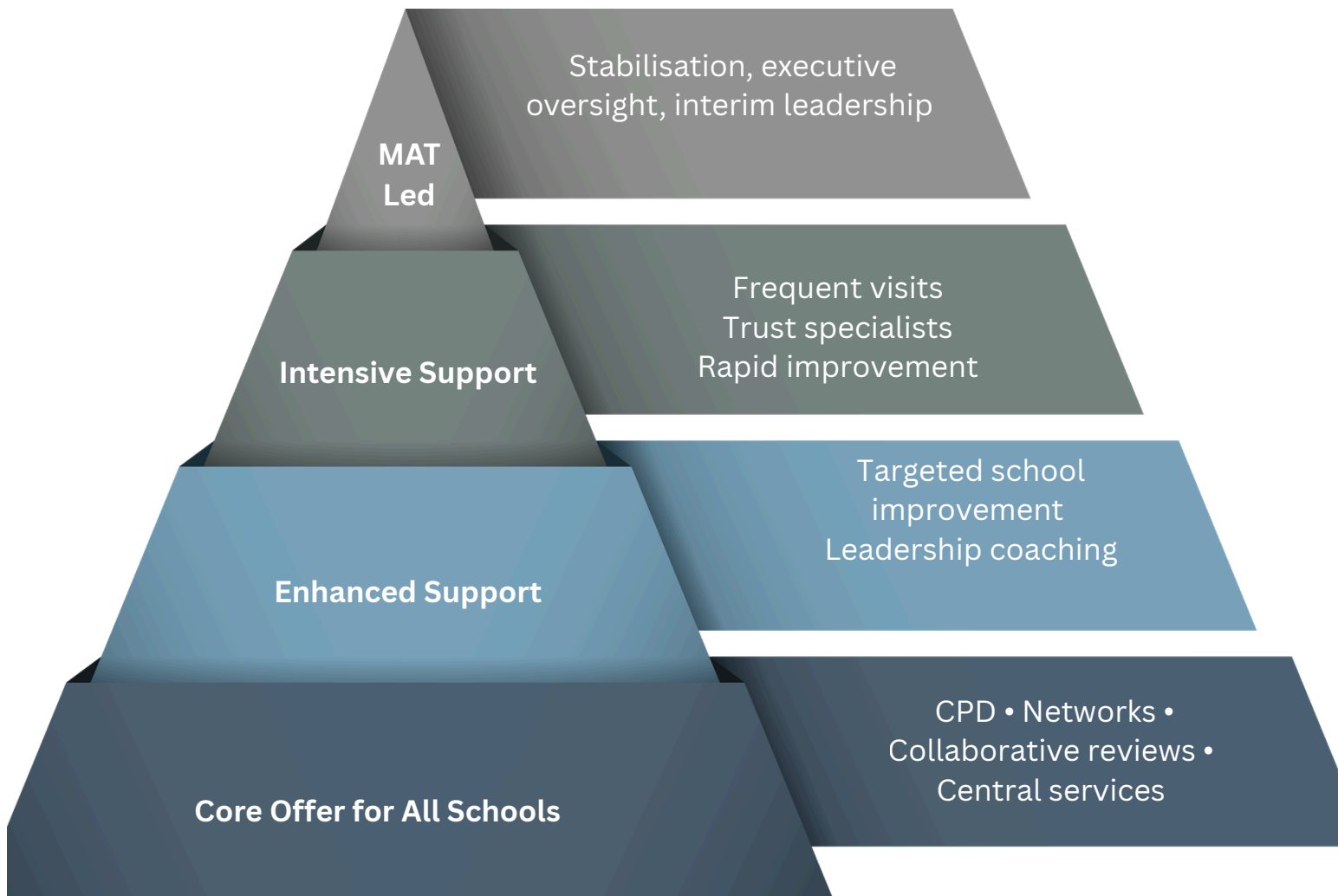
Being part of the Trust enables schools to draw on the collective knowledge and experience of leaders and teachers across the partnership. Through collaboration and professional networks, staff are able to share expertise, develop curriculum practice and learn from colleagues in other schools. Working within a group of schools also creates wider opportunities for professional development and career progression. Staff may contribute to Trust-wide initiatives, lead areas of development or collaborate across schools, enabling them to grow as practitioners and leaders. Through this shared expertise, the Trust strengthens practice, develops leadership and supports schools to continually improve outcomes for pupils.
